1 LECTURE CAPTURE AND VIDEOS

Record lectures or upload videos for students to view from any web enabled device at their own pace and as many times as they need.

Use captures in your course to...

- Add variety to instructional delivery
- Audio only podcast lectures
- Content for flipped online or blended courses
- Course welcome video
- Introduction videos for a class, module or topic
- Makeup for missed lectures due to excused absences or snow days
- Record videos anywhere (lab, office, other remote locations outside a physical classroom) with Personal Capture
- Remediation videos
- Self-evaluation of teaching and presentation techniques
- Short videos that address student confusion or misconceptions
- Recorded student presentations and demonstrations for critique and review by peers or instructors.

2 PRESENTATION SLIDES

Upload presentation slides to share with students.

Use presentations in your course to...

- Summarize key points
- Provide PDF files for student reading.
- Illustrate concepts and lecture topics
- Embed Vimeo and YouTube videos
- Embed a digital whiteboard by annotating blank presentation slides

3 ANALYTICS

View, filter and sort data gathered as students interact in a course to gain valuable insight to student levels of engagement and participation.

Analyze student data from you course to...

- Determine if students are viewing Learning Captures.
- Identify content areas students find the most confusing.
- Identify if students are viewing content, how much and how often
- Identify presentation slides or video locations that have the least and most number of student views
- Track student participation.

4 CONTENT LIBRARY

Organize your teaching content in one place where it can be easily published to courses and shared with others.
